






"Intellectuals' Park" Established within the Nationwide "Green Future" Marathon

Uzbekistan Presented Its Main Climate Goals at the UN Climate Summit in New York

On September 24, the UN Climate Summit was held in New York at the initiative of UN Secretary-General António Guterres and Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva.

The event gathered representatives from nearly 100 countries, including leaders from more than 40 nations.

The main focus of the meeting was preparation for the upcoming COP30 Conference, which will take place in Belém, Brazil, in November under the framework of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

During the summit, Uzbekistan presented its key climate action goals, emphasizing the country's commitment to reducing greenhouse gas emissions, enhancing climate resilience, and promoting sustainable, green development.

During the competition, participants were presented with questions related to ecology, waste recycling, rational use of natural resources, green lifestyles, and global environmental issues.
















3,000 Trees Planted in Karmana District as Part of the "Green Nation" Project
