

Navoi State University contributes the government's efforts to achieve the SDGs by 2030. NSU collaborates with the government, business institutions, other universities, non-governmental organizations and other parties in conducting research and providing community services to expedite the attainment of the SDGs targets in Uzbekistan. Navoi State Pedagogical Institute actively participates in the development of society, provides equal opportunities for education of all segments of the population and solves the global problems of the Navoi region and Uzbekistan. The University is aware of its role in creating a fair, educated and socially responsible community. We are determined to promote sustainable development in research and education. As a pedagogical institute, we are able to develop solutions to global problems based on sustainable development goals.



Navoi State University (NSU) actively participated in a high-level seminar aimed at advancing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through innovation, education, and effective institutional collaboration. The event was held following the open dialogue on February 17 at the Ministry of Higher Education, Science, and Innovation, where Minister Qo'ng'irotdoy Sharipov and First Deputy Prosecutor General Bahrriddin Valiev discussed strategies to attract foreign investment and enhance the export potential of higher education institutions. During the seminar, NSU representatives contributed ideas on improving the university's investment environment, integrating sustainability principles into education, and developing research-based innovations. The discussions emphasized the importance of fostering green growth, academic partnerships, and entrepreneurial initiatives that align with SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals). NSU's participation demonstrated its ongoing commitment to promoting sustainable academic and economic development, supporting Uzbekistan's national priorities, and contributing to the global SDG agenda.



1. Navoi State University (NSU) hosted the “Rahbar va yoshlar” (Leaders and Youth) meeting, bringing together students, faculty, and local authorities to discuss opportunities for personal and professional development, in line with SDG 4: Quality Education. Deputy Governor of Navoi Region J. Khodjayev visited the university to learn about its facilities, academic programs, research initiatives, and efforts to support students' creativity and talents. Accompanied by Rector Prof. Mukhiddin Kalonov, he attended presentations and engaged in discussions with students, faculty, and employer representatives. The meeting focused on guiding graduates on how to make the most of available opportunities, develop their skills, and prepare for future careers. Students also shared their achievements and proposed ideas for further improvement, fostering dialogue between youth and leaders to support educational growth and lifelong learning.





At the Navoi State University "On additional measures to strengthen the personal responsibility of the heads of state management bodies and local executive authorities in the effective organization of the implementation of legislative documents" (<https://lex.uz/docs/5439350>) and the Decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan dated May 31, 2021 No. PQ-5132 No. PQ-5132 A seminar was organized to ensure the implementation of the decision (<https://lex.uz/docs/5439350>). In the seminar, normative legal documents on strengthening enforcement discipline, registration and operation from "ijro.gov.uz", system operation mechanism, document registration and attachment processes were explained in detail. The seminar was attended by the management of the institute, department heads and employees, deans.

NSU delegation attended in the conference "Sustainable development as a vector of attractiveness" was held as part of the activities of "Campus France-2022" and the II Forum of France-Uzbekistan universities. Lectures by professors and teachers of prestigious French higher education institutions and a number of specialists were heard there. After that, a seminar titled "Towards a new regional mobility center in Central Asia: Uzbekistan's policy of international openness and its cooperation opportunities with France" was held. In the lectures of the heads of higher educational institutions, the integration of the higher education system of Uzbekistan into the global educational space, the strategy of cooperation with French universities, the creation of projects of the two countries and their success were discussed about the important aspects of relations.





Navoi State University (NSU) maintains a moderate but consistent involvement in cross-sectoral dialogue related to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). While the university is not the main national coordinator, it regularly collaborates with government offices, local authorities, NGOs, and community organizations on sustainability-focused discussions and events.

1. National Conference on “Digital Technologies in Primary Education and Developing Speaking Competence”

NSU participated in the national conference titled “Digital Technologies in Primary Education and Developing Speaking Competence: Modern Conditions and Prospects,” organized in accordance with the resolutions of the Cabinet of Ministers (No. 39, April 27, 2024) and the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation (Order No. 118, May 2, 2024).

The event was hosted by the Faculty of Preschool and Primary Education.

The conference brought together a broad range of participants, including professors and researchers from NSU, students, master’s and doctoral candidates, and academics from higher education institutions across Tashkent, Samarkand, Bukhara, and Khorezm regions.

The dialogue focused on two key thematic areas:

- **Promising digital technologies in primary education**, including the integration of modern ICT tools into the teaching process;
- **Developing speech competence in early learners**, addressing pedagogical approaches and innovative methods to strengthen communication skills.

Through discussions, presentations, and academic exchanges, the event created a platform for collaboration between universities, educational authorities, and regional academic partners. It contributed to improving teaching quality, promoting modern educational technologies, and supporting the development of digital and communicative skills among young learners.



2. International Conference on “Modern Digital Technologies in Education: Problems and Prospects”

The Faculty of Mathematics and Informatics at NSU initiated and hosted an international scientific-practical conference titled “Modern Digital Technologies in Education: Problems and Prospects.” The event brought together participants from both domestic and foreign educational institutions, creating a platform for academic dialogue and exchange of expertise.

During the conference, scholars and practitioners shared research findings and practical insights on emerging digital tools used in teaching and learning.

Discussions also addressed broader global challenges associated with digitization, including technological gaps, teacher preparedness, and the future of digital pedagogy. Participants explored potential solutions, highlighted successful practices, and proposed areas for further collaboration. The conference strengthened academic cooperation between NSU and its international partners, supporting the advancement of digital education and contributing to ongoing efforts to enhance innovation and quality in the educational process.



3. Participation in the 3rd International Congress of Tourism and Ecology

A group of students and youth representatives from NSU actively participated in the **3rd International Congress of Tourism and Ecology**, held under the slogan “Youth are the creators of our future.” The congress brought together participants from over 15 countries, creating an international platform for discussing tourism development, ecological awareness, and youth leadership.

During the event, several NSU students were elected to key regional youth leadership positions.

Akmal Zakirov, Youth Leader of NSU, was elected Chairman of the Council of Tourism Ambassadors of Navoi Region, recognizing his contributions to promoting local tourism initiatives.

Kamronbek Sultanmuradov, a 3rd-year student of the Faculty of History and a youth coordinator, was appointed Chairman of the Movement of Young Environmentalists of Navoi Region, reflecting his active role in environmental advocacy and education.

In addition, under the leadership of Zafar Bekboyev, coordinator of the Faculty of Arts, the NSU youth team participated in the “We Are One Team – Hello Conference” event, where they were awarded a special certificate and souvenirs for their teamwork and engagement.

The congress created valuable opportunities for NSU students to engage in international dialogue, strengthen ecological responsibility, and contribute to the development of tourism and environmental initiatives within the region.

4. Participation in the Uzbekistan–Hungary II Rectors’ Forum and Official Reception at Károly Gáspár University

As part of the Uzbekistan–Hungary II Rectors’ Forum, the delegation of Uzbekistan—which included representatives from NSU—was officially welcomed at Károly Gáspár University in Budapest on May 17. The reception was held in the historic Károly Sekonitsa Palace and was attended by university leaders, government representatives, and academic delegations from both countries.

During the ceremony, the Rector of Károly Gáspár University, László Trócsányi, and the Chairman of the Hungarian Rectors’ Conference, László Borhy, delivered welcoming remarks.

They emphasized the growing cooperation between Uzbekistan and Hungary in higher education and scientific research. The speakers highlighted that the expanding partnerships—particularly academic exchanges involving students, doctoral candidates, researchers, and professors—are strengthening mutual knowledge and experience sharing.

Komiljon Karimov, First Deputy Minister of Higher Education, Science and Innovation of Uzbekistan, expressed gratitude for the warm reception and noted that hosting representatives of Uzbekistan’s academic community in a building of great historical significance reflected Hungary’s respect for educational collaboration.

The reception concluded with a cultural program featuring performances by young artists from the Hungarian Academy of Choreography, contributing to a warm atmosphere of friendship and intercultural exchange.



5. Educational Event: “Family Strength is the Guarantee of Social Peace”

In recognition of the International Day of Families (May 15), NSU organized an educational event titled “Family Strength is the Guarantee of Social Peace” in collaboration with the Faculty of History and the Memorial Museum of Victims of Repression.

The program highlighted cultural traditions, social values, and the role of family stability in maintaining community harmony. Female students of the faculty presented an exhibition of national handicrafts, as well as traditional dances and songs reflecting regional heritage.

N. Orokova, leading specialist of the State Museum of History and Culture of the Navoi Region, delivered an informative presentation on traditional ceremonies such as the bride’s greeting ritual and the symbolic significance of the “lachak” (headscarf) in Uzbek culture. The event encouraged dialogue on cultural preservation, social cohesion, and the continuity of national values.



6. A short-term training course was organized for women and girls' activists from various neighborhoods across the Navoi region.

The initiative brought together 152 participants from Navoi city, Ghazgon, Karmana, Navbahor, and Nurota districts, creating a regional platform where community representatives and the university could jointly discuss social issues affecting women and families.

The training included both theoretical and practical sessions delivered by NSU specialists, including the dean's advisers on women and girls' affairs and the institute psychologist, D. Abduraimova. These sessions addressed topics such as community leadership, supporting vulnerable groups, promoting social participation, and strengthening the role of women in local development.

By hosting this program, NSU facilitated direct dialogue between academic staff and grassroots women leaders, enabling knowledge transfer, shared problem-solving, and cooperative planning. The initiative demonstrated how the university engages with community organizations and local governance structures to promote social empowerment, enhance community education, and build stronger, more inclusive neighborhood networks.



7. As part of the “Youth Breath” initiative, a regional running marathon was organized under the slogan “Youth Movement – For Health,” bringing together participants from various sectors.

The event involved regional enterprises, public organizations, educational institutions, and youth groups from local neighborhoods, creating a collaborative platform focused on promoting healthy lifestyles and community engagement.

Students and sports enthusiasts from Navoi State University actively took part in the marathon, joining representatives from different institutions in discussions on youth well-being, public health awareness, and the importance of community-based sports initiatives. The event facilitated interaction between the university, regional organizations, and local communities, allowing stakeholders to share perspectives on how to encourage physical activity, support youth development, and strengthen social cohesion.

Through its participation, NSU contributed to a broader cross-sector dialogue on improving community health culture and expanding youth involvement in socially beneficial activities, demonstrating the university's commitment to regional cooperation and public engagement.

8. Republican Scientific-Practical Conference on Climate Change, Green Economy, and Sustainable Development

Navoi State University hosted the Republican Scientific-Practical Conference, bringing together representatives from national research institutions, higher education establishments, and sector specialists. Participants presented their scientific perspectives and proposals related to climate change, environmental sustainability, and economic development.

As part of the conference program, Section 2 — “Economic Stability and Green Economy” was held at the Faculty of Economics. The session included in-depth discussions and presentations on the following topics:



- Green economy and green energy potential





Navoi State University actively strengthens its international partnerships through a wide range of initiatives in education, research, innovation, and youth engagement. The university collaborates with global and regional institutions to exchange knowledge, develop joint projects, and contribute to shared approaches in areas such as sustainability, digital transformation, science, and cultural cooperation.

1. In collaboration with Abai Kazakh National Pedagogical University, NSU jointly held the 1st International Conference for Achieving the Sustainability Development Goals. The conference was held at Abai Kazakh National Pedagogical University in Almaty, Kazakhstan. The event brought together the latest thoughts, and data gathered related to implementing the SDGs. In addition, a total of more than 120 research articles in different topics that cover most of the SDGs. It has been attended by a group of distinguished personalities from different nationalities, including Turkish, Uzbek and others, in addition to postgraduate students, mostly those who are NSU graduates. In this context, this conference has highlighted the most important and recent advancements between reality and expectations to achieve sustainable development goals because of their role in establishing and developing strategic development visions, given the changes the world is going through at various levels, especially the political, economic, and social one. We attempt to discuss this according to a set of core issues including the role of the public sector, private sector, and local and international organizations in achieving the goals of sustainable development and their benefits in the light of United Nations Vision 2030



2. The young people of the institute took part in the III International Congress of Tourism and Ecology under the slogan **"Youth are the creators of our future"** - Navoi State University. On August 8-13 of this year, the youth of the Navoi State University, including the youth of the Navoi State University, participated in the III International Congress of 15 countries of the world, including youth leader Akmal Zakirov, who was elected as the chairman of the Council of Tourism Ambassadors of the Navoi region. Kamronbek Sultanmuradov, a student of the 3rd stage of the Faculty of History, youth coordinator, was elected as the chairman of the movement of young environmentalists in Navoi region. Also, under the leadership of Zafar Bekboyev, the coordinator of the Faculty of Arts, the Navoi team took part in the event "We are one team - hello conference" and was awarded with a special certificate and souvenirs.



3. Navoi State University organized a prestigious conference in cooperation with the international scientific magazine "Science and innovation" under the title "Modern trends of teaching physics in the environment of information and innovative technologies: problems and solutions." To study the problems and solutions of teaching physics in the environment of modern information and innovative technologies, to introduce students to modern teaching methods, as well as to develop cooperation to reduce the limitations between the theory and practice of physics, and to effectively use innovative technologies in teaching physics. It aims to apply, develop teaching methods, study modern approaches, carry out scientific and practical work on them, and develop cooperation.

- Modern trends in the use of scientific heritage in improving green technologies
- Use of modern educational technologies (pedagogical, information technologies) in teaching physics in the continuous education system.
- Problems and solutions of using an integrative and interdisciplinary approach in teaching physics.
- Actual problems and solutions of the environment.

4. Navoi State University held an international scientific-practical conference on the topic "Relationship of different systematic languages in the era of globalization". The conference discussed the problems, solutions, strategies of comparative and world linguistics, linguistics, literary studies, experience, innovations, current problems of modern philology, and Uzbek-Azerbaijani. issues such as literary relations were discussed. In the conference, influential scientists from the Republics of Turkey, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, and Tajikistan took part in their lectures online. In particular, the lectures of Turkish professor Gunesh Nuray, Azerbaijani professors Almaz Ülvî Binnətova, Alizadeh Asgarli, Kazakh professor Zhanna Botaboeva, Tajik scientists B. Fayzulloyev, T. Turdiboyev were listened to with great interest by scientists. researches, new analysis and interpretations, and strategic goals were presented to the people of sciences



5. During the recent meeting of the Council of Heads of State of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan, Shavkat Mirziyoyev, proposed several initiatives aimed at strengthening multilateral cooperation, enhancing regional economic stability, and promoting collaboration in education, science, innovation, and youth development. Key initiatives included:



- Organizing the CIS **Innovation Industry Forum** within the “INNOPROM” exhibition in Tashkent, promoting regional technological cooperation and innovation.
- Developing a **multilateral action plan in digitalization and artificial intelligence**, while expanding cooperation in science, education, and culture.
- Preparing a **new interstate agreement on the mutual recognition of diplomas**, and hosting the **CIS Youth Forum in Khiva**, including the establishment of a **Youth Innovation Laboratory** to support cross-border youth projects and innovation initiatives.



Navoi State University (NSU) actively participates in these national initiatives by:

- Contributing to discussions and programs on **academic mobility and international recognition of qualifications**, in line with the proposed diploma recognition agreement.
- Engaging in research and innovation projects related to digitalization, AI, and applied sciences, collaborating with regional and international partners.
- Encouraging **youth participation in innovation and sustainability projects**, including preparation for competitions, forums, and collaborative initiatives that align with the planned Youth Innovation Laboratory.

Through these activities, NSU demonstrates its commitment to **international cooperation, knowledge exchange, and youth development**, supporting Uzbekistan’s broader efforts in multilateral partnerships and regional integration.

6. A delegation from Ural Federal University, led by President Viktor Koksharov, paid an official visit to Navoi State University. During the meeting, both universities discussed establishing a comprehensive cooperation framework, including joint projects, academic and research activities, and conferences. Agreements were reached to implement programs for **student and faculty mobility**, enhancing academic exchange between the institutions. This visit represents a significant step toward **strengthening strategic partnerships and fostering international research collaboration**, benefiting both universities.





7. During an official visit to Beijing on 2 September, the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan, Shavkat Mirziyoyev, met with Premier Li Xiang of the State Council of the People's Republic of China. The discussion focused on **multifaceted practical cooperation** between the two countries, including the expansion of collaboration in the **education sector**.

In 2025, Uzbekistan will host its second Education Forum, and “Lu Ban Workshops” will be established across the country to develop modern professional skills. Additionally, plans were proposed to establish the Uzbekistan–China Artificial Intelligence Development Center, aimed at promoting research and supporting innovative startup projects.

Navoi State University actively aligns with these initiatives by participating in programs that enhance academic collaboration, research in emerging technologies, and the development of innovation-driven opportunities for students and faculty. These efforts demonstrate NSU's commitment to international partnerships, knowledge exchange, and the advancement of applied research and innovation.

8. Navoi State University – Advancing International Cooperation


An online meeting was held between Navoi State University (NSU) and the Ural State University of Economics (USUE), Russia, to strengthen bilateral collaboration. The meeting was chaired by NSU Rector, Doctor of Economics, Professor B.M. Kalonov. During the discussions, both universities explored promising areas of cooperation and reached significant agreements. Key outcomes included:

- Introduction of a 2+2 joint educational program in the field of economics.

- Implementation of student exchange and academic mobility programs.

- Strengthening bilateral institutional relations and fostering ongoing collaboration.

This partnership not only enhances NSU's international reputation but also provides students with opportunities to gain foreign experience, access high-quality education, and expand their research capabilities. The collaboration reflects NSU's commitment to international academic cooperation, knowledge exchange, and capacity-building for students and faculty.



Student volunteering programmes

1. Active volunteer youth




4. Volunteers continue to contribute to worthy causes.

"I AM A DONOR" campaign was held with the participation of volunteers of the Navoi State University. Young volunteers of the institute took an active part in this action along with several organizations at the regional blood transfusion station.



5. In Navoi, the “Give Breath to the Trees” environmental campaign month is currently being held. As part of this initiative, inspections were carried out in the “Bahor” neighborhood of Navoi city, where 12 cases of environmental violations were identified. Among them, electric wires and lights had been attached to 8 trees, while the bases of 4 trees had been covered with concrete. Immediate action was taken to remove the harmful electrical fixtures and concrete coverings, after which the trees were watered and restored. Responsible representatives of business entities involved were officially warned about the violations. The “Give Breath to the Trees” campaign continues actively across the region, organized by the Youth and Student Organization of Navoi State University to promote environmental awareness and protect urban greenery



6. Meeting at Navoi State University on Graduate Employment Opportunities

A meeting focused on graduate employment was held at Navoi State University. The guest, Mehmet Tarhan, Executive Director of “MENGI TEKSTIL GROUP”, met with NSU Rector, Professor Muxiddin Kalonov, to discuss bilateral cooperation, preparing graduates for the labor market, and facilitating their employment.

Target Community: Local women, youth, and residents of Navoiy city and nearby districts

Activity Type: Community legal education and empowerment outreach event

To promote social inclusion and civic engagement, Navoiy State University, in partnership with the Navoiy Regional Department of Justice, organized a legal awareness and empowerment seminar focused on strengthening the role of women and youth in community life. The event coincided with International Day of Families (15 May) and aimed to increase legal literacy and social activity among local residents.

The seminar featured expert talks and interactive discussions addressing citizens' rights, women's access to entrepreneurship opportunities, and legal support mechanisms for families and vulnerable groups.

Ms. Gulsanam Norova, Lecturer at the Department of Linguistics and Head of the Regional Women's Entrepreneurship Center, presented detailed information on state programs supporting women entrepreneurs, available financial incentives, and training initiatives that encourage female participation in business and public life.

The session provided a practical platform for dialogue between citizens and justice representatives, strengthening community trust and awareness.

In support of national constitutional reforms and the development of civic awareness, Navoiy State University organized a public outreach seminar at the Navoiy Regional Tax Authority under the theme “Our Constitution – the Foundation of Peace and Prosperity.”

During the event, Associate Professor Murod Rahmatov delivered a presentation on “The Renewed Constitution in the New Uzbekistan,” explaining the purpose, structure, and significance of the amendments included in the new Constitutional Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan. The session emphasized how these updates strengthen democratic governance, expand citizens’ rights, and reinforce social justice.

In continuation of the outreach initiative, Dr. Rahmatov also conducted follow-up lectures at the Central Bank’s Navoiy branch and local commercial banks, providing employees with detailed explanations of constitutional reforms and their implications for everyday civic and professional responsibilities.


Target Community: University students, youth leaders, and medical faculty members, residents

Activity Type: Civic education and awareness outreach seminar

The Faculty of Medicine at Navoiy State University organized a large-scale civic education seminar under the slogan “The Constitution belongs to me, to you, to all of us!” as part of the “Referendum and Youth” national awareness campaign. The initiative aimed to strengthen civic consciousness among young people and to familiarize them with the new constitutional reforms taking place in Uzbekistan.

The event brought together a wide range of participants, including the “Targ‘ibot poyezdi” delegation — a group of students and professors from the Tashkent State University of Law, representatives from the Regional Health Department, deputy Mahfuza Khamroyeva, and experts such as Mr. Dilshod Murtazayev (Senior Lecturer) and Mr. Vali Turakulov (Head of Department, Navoiy State University).

During the session, speakers discussed the content and importance of constitutional reforms, particularly focusing on new provisions supporting education, healthcare, and scientific development, as well as policies aimed at empowering youth and ensuring their active participation in democratic processes. The event encouraged students to see the constitution as a living document that guarantees their rights to quality education, health services, and professional development.



4. Advisory Consultations for Navoi Free Industrial Economic Zone (NFEZ) Residents

Navoi State University hosted a full-day Technical Energy Consultation Program for manufacturing and service companies operating within the Navoi Free Industrial Economic Zone (FIEZ). The initiative aimed to help local enterprises reduce electricity expenses and improve compliance with emerging national energy-efficiency requirements.

Throughout the day, university environmental and resource-efficiency specialists conducted individual diagnostic sessions with company representatives. These consultations included:

- Review of electricity consumption schedules, identifying peak-load inefficiencies and unnecessary standby power usage;
 - Assessment of lighting systems, comparing existing configurations with potential LED transition models and smart-sensor solutions;
 - Analysis of machinery operation patterns, focusing on motors, pumps, ventilation units, and refrigeration systems that often contribute to avoidable energy losses;
 - Evaluation of building-level factors, such as insulation, natural lighting potential, and air leakage.
- Based on the diagnostics, each participating company received a customized Energy-Saving Action Plan, tailored to their production profile and budget. Recommendations focused on practical, low-cost improvements, including:
- gradual LED conversion,
 - installation of timers and occupancy sensors,
 - optimization of ventilation and cooling cycles,
 - load shifting strategies to reduce nighttime and idle-time consumption,
 - basic maintenance routines to eliminate energy waste.



5. University–Community Green Awareness Initiative

Following the announcement of Presidential Decree PF-61, the university organized small informative sessions and awareness meetings for the nearby community. These sessions explained the main ideas of the decree, including the promotion of environmental protection, green initiatives, renewable energy use, youth-led ecological projects, and opportunities related to the ‘Yashil tashabbuslar’ (Green Initiatives) Fund. The outreach aimed to increase environmental awareness, support youth ecological activities, and encourage community participation in sustainable practices.
